2: that interns don't "stir things up." Inmates need to get along within the penal system.

• PTI's response: We teach our interns to invite introspection and connection with self. We do not encourage them to be social workers or educators. We do not present the material of others.

• Requirements: PTI's professional liability and improper sexual conduct liability insurance policy should cover our employees wherever they go. However, Jessie prefers that each intern have their own professional liability coverage as well. She may ask you for a copy of your enrollment or latest renewal letter.

Hours: Healthy Starts office hours are from 8am to 4 pm. The Family Learning Center houses Adult Ed, a Preschool, Healthy Start and others, and is open till 10 pm. If you want to see people later than 4 p.m, you must arrange that with Healthy Start ahead of time. H.S will then arrange to have the rooms unlocked, etc.

• Requirement #1: Kathy will need a paragraph about what intern's experience has been. The principal, counselor, etc. of the school intern will be involved with, will see this information.

• Requirement #2: Participant must complete fingerprinting and TB test. PTI sends Healthy Start a letter saying both have been done.

• Healthy Start's goal is to link students and families to services which they need in order to improve academic, health, and well being. It is also to educate and empower families to help themselves. This includes basic needs, food, shelter, clothing, and counseling, (all free), and a nurse practitioner (sliding scale).

• Students come from anywhere in the San Jose East Side school district and are any age from preschool to high school. The younger kids are mostly from regular elementary schools; older kids are mostly attending alternative schools - middle and high.

• Referrals usually come from nurse, school counselor, etc. Occasionally from parents. Referral form will have the referrer's contact info, the symptoms, parent's name and phone #.

• There will be a contact person at the school, especially on the 1st day you get there, to go over procedures such as how to get a student out of class, where to go, etc.

• You can work with any age you want. Kathy needs to be told as soon as possible what ages, etc. you want to work with. It takes a few days to arrange things with the various school principals, counselors, teachers, etc.

• You can choose to work with elementary, middle, or secondary aged children. You are welcome to work with individual children, run groups, teach parenting classes at night, do family therapy after school, whatever. Parents often speak Spanish; there may be an interpreter available.

• There are two rooms at Healthy Start itself in which to see clients. During the day, counselors usually see children at the school they attend.
